

The wind was howling out of Wrigley on Wednesday and that's all Caleb needed to finally get the ball rolling from the plate this year. He had 7 of his 21 Homers this season in the matchup against the Dusters. It included 15 RBI's and a 1.000 batting average going 9 for 9. It seems to happen every year, a couple guys look to take over as MVP then he has a game like this and seems to remind everyone how he has won 3 straight year. His 2018 Salary Performance jumped \$6 dollars this week and he sits at \$59.99 with Jackson Buzea at \$51.30 in 2nd place.

Not only has he shined, but his roster has shined. Alec Gerlach came on to the scene early in the season and seems to improve each week. He has increased \$4 since his signing and is solidifying himself as a true #2. James Haworth has had an up and down year but sits \$7 over his signing salary. Finally, Justin Deckinga has doubled his salary from last year improving \$14, a steal for the Liners.



All 3 players drafted by the Clams are off the main roster. Another injury to Austin Gibson and work issues with Sitter gave way to Matt opening the flood gates. This past weekend he made what looks to be the final move for the Clams with a fresh new look. The Clams signed ORWBL Commissioner, Alex Friedman, to play along Lucas Miedema and Kevin Vroegh.



GBL wastes time in Indy.


