Do you want to control who you play with on a week to week basis? Then listen in as I discuss everything you need to know on how to become an owner and what the requirements are to lead a team to a Leroy Championship.

Every league has them, someone who runs the team. Some leagues use MLB names, and others have Franchises that get past along from manager to manager. Leroy is a bit different. Each Franchise can't be given to another player, it stays with that person until he decides to give it up. Each owner can decide to change the name each year or colors, but the history of every team that person ran will forever be meshed together as one franchise. Jordan Mosel created the Franchise the Backdoor Sliders in 2014 and has kept the name each year with logo changes and some minor color changes. While Grant Reynhout's Franchise had 4 different names (Muffin Men, Soup A Stars, Muffin Men, Big Unit Bashers) in its 4-year history. The option is yours but remember the franchise you run depends on you. (Continued)

Corn Bombers





Team Owner 101

"If you don't build your dream, someone will hire you to build theirs."

"Never underestimate the importance of research."

So, first things first, how do I decide who gets asked to be an owner. It's simple, attendance. When you play a game Leroy you get added to the almighty Leroy Player's Association Group on Facebook (If you don't have it, I recommend getting it just for this). If you haven't played a game, but are a fan of the league, we might still let you in. Just ask to join! Here I post anything and everything related to the league including the award races. One of the awards we give out is the Ironman Award. This award goes to the player with the most at bats and innings pitched in the season, obviously the more you come the higher you get. It also takes in how good your team is, the better teams will get more at bats per game then their counterparts as well as make a deeper playoff run getting more of each (Yes awards take into consideration the playoffs). Anyway, this is the answer.... Ironman. I scroll through the list of players which currently sits at 77 for the year and go from 1 to whenever the owner spots are filled. Does this mean some owner's won't be asked that are currently owners? Perhaps. It forces owners to play out the whole season to stay high on the list in hopes of becoming an owner again, while also gives new comers the shot to be an owner right away if they come every single week and become a dedicated player of the league. I don't care how good you are, I care how dedicated you are.

The number is looking like its going to be 14 teams next year, and many people are interested in the requirements to be an owner. First, active on Facebook. It's such an easy tool for me to use to get everyone on the same page. I message owner's every week going through the waiver wire and owner's can make moves to their team. I also use the chat to vote on rule changes and give info about upcoming games each week. I also discuss salary penalties (scoresheet mistakes, not having full team, changing lineup) in the chat.

Second you must attend the owner's meeting or have someone there to represent you. We have an owner's meeting in the fall to discuss big rule changes, preparation for the season, select draft order, announce team's, give out schedules, and so forth. We also plan the date for our Bowling Classic where we hold the draft. Owner's are not required to be at the draft but will get hit with a \$1 penalty and must have someone there to represent you. Other than that, it isn't much to it, besides being responsible for making sure your score sheets are right on game day and your lineups are correct. We will start 2019 with 6 man rosters out of the gate giving owners the opportunity to field a 4-man mandatory lineup on opening day. If you are potentially interested and have questions on what is entailed be sure to message me and ask because we desperately need someone to replace Robby !!! J/K Bud ©

Player Spotlight, Who is it?




This player joined the league in 2017, he has played for 3 teams this season and is in the running for most improved player of the year.

Tim: You and your brother, Mitchell, came into the league at the same time and experienced good success early. Lately you have slowly evolved into a star #2 for the Liners, while Mitchell has treaded water so to speak. What do you contribute most to your rookie success compared to your brother's?

Alex Gerlach (Lake County Liners): Most of my success I would say comes from my teammates. For example Caleb saw me early on as a player who had potential so he showed me how to properly throw the ball. Given I was a pitcher when I played baseball really helped me along the way since pitching is such a big component. Like I said, I have a great set of teammates that been giving me advice on how to play the game since I've been picked up.

Tim: In 2015 & 2017 you had 58 Homers in 29 Games, in 2016 & 2018 you have 18 Homers in 21 Games. Why the struggle in even years?

Jack Hillegonds (Leroy Truckers): I think every year people just get better at pitching. When pitchers first start out they aren't used to throwing a wiffleball because it's totally different than any other. Each year players add more pitches to their arsenal making it a lot tougher on the hitters. Why the even years? I honestly didn't know that, that's pretty funny though.

Tim: Last year you played 10 games, you currently have played 11 so far this year. Both your pitching and batting numbers have improved; Slugging went from 1.080 to 1.300 with 8 more homers, your ERA dropped from 6.40 to 2.12. You're in the top 6 in Batter, Pitcher, Rookie, and Most Improved. Which of those four awards would you most like to win?

Wes Ellis (Bushleague Badgers): I definitely would want to win the Most Improved, but at the end of the day I'm just playing my game. Shouldn't be a surprise to anyone who knows me, I just had to make a few adjustments and get more comfortable with this playing style.







Tim: Not only were you the 100th player in the history of the league, but the first player born in the 2000's. In 5 games you have a 0.167 batting average and a 7.00 ERA, but we're just signed by the Clams. Being the youngest player in the league do you feel pressure or motivated competing with guys up to 10 years older than you?

Josh Smits (Leroy Clams): First those stats are terrible so maybe don't post those. I definitely felt a little bit nervous. I knew going into it that many of the people were older with experience, but I didn't realize how different the game was fundamentally from Baseball. After giving up 6 runs in an inning I was feeling a lot more nervous than motivated. In recent weeks I have steadidily improved and have gained confidence and motivation to be a steady competitor in the league.

Tim: The top 12 Ranked Players in the league become All Stars, currently you sit 13th. Your Batting Average is 0.375 and your opponents Batting Average is 0.376. Which do you want to see improved the most to get an all star spot.

John Eenigenburg (Sultans of Soy):
Seeing by batting average go up would
be helpful, but I've really surprised
myself with how much my pitching has
improved as the season has progressed.
If I keep striking guys out and limiting
runs, I see that helping me the most.
